

# Trauma-Informed Yoga

This year, Tahoe SAFE Alliance began working with Firefly Yoga International to provide

trauma-informed yoga to survivors of abuse as well as staff

and volunteers. Trauma can have far-reaching impacts not only on the survivor but the professional helpers in the survivor's life. Tahoe SAFE Alliance created this mixed yoga group to address the self-care needs of everyone affected by intimate partner and sexual violence in our community.

Yoga has been shown to be an effective method for healing from trauma. Trauma-informed yoga connects the mind and body while facilitating a controlled release of trauma energy stored in the body. Yoga practice can be a key component of holistic treatment of trauma.

"Trauma-informed yoga gets back to the pure roots of practicing yoga. It's not to look more fit, do crazy arm balances, be pushed beyond your limits or any of the other interesting reasons people are drawn to yoga. It's purely to practice awareness of the body and the breath. To gain a mindful state on the mat in order to take it with you in your life off the mat."
